

Current Sex

Female	This is the gender identity where the sex assigned at birth is female and the person identifies as the same.
Male	This is the gender identity where the sex assigned at birth is male and the person identifies as the same.
Unknown	Individuals may use this value when the gender is not clear at birth.

Birth Sex

Female	This is the gender identity where the sex assigned at birth is female and the person identifies as the same.
Intersex	Individuals may use this value when they have both male and female sex characteristics at birth.
Male	This is the gender identity where the sex assigned at birth is male and the person identifies as the same.
Unknown	Individuals may use this value when the gender is not clear at birth.

Pronouns

He/Him/His	He/Him/His are gender-specific pronouns that are usually used to refer to men or boys. This is different than gender neutral pronouns, which do not associate the person being referred to with any specific gender.
She/Her/Hers	She/Her/Hers is a set of gender-specific pronouns typically used to refer to women or girls. Some nonbinary folks, as well as genderfluid or genderqueer folks, may also use the She/Her/Hers as pronouns.
They/Them/Theirs	Use these pronouns when you identify as gender neutral or gender non-conforming to reflect as your identity and gender expression, rather than "he/him" or "she/her" pronouns that designate a person as male or female.
Xe/Xem/Xir	Xe/Xem/Xir and its variations are gender neutral pronouns can be used to when individual wants to be referred to as people who are non-binary, genderfluid, genderqueer, trans, and/or do not identify with the gender binary.
Ze/Hir/Hirs	Pronouns used in the trans community. These pronouns offer inclusion and accuracy for someone who does not identify by the male/female gender classifications.
Ze/Zir/Zirs	Pronouns used in the trans community. These pronouns offer inclusion and accuracy for someone who does not identify by the male/female gender classifications.
Address me by name	Address me by my name should be used when an individual do not wish to be referred as any pronoun instead wants their name to be used to address them.
Prefer not to say	Individuals should use this value when they do not prefer to disclose the pronouns.
Not in list	Use this value when the pronoun value you would like to select is not in the list.

Sexual Orientation

Asexual	Asexuality is a spectrum. An asexual person feels little or no sexual attraction. It is a sexual orientation and is different from being gay or straight as well as from celibacy or abstinence. The spectrum of asexuality contains much diversity in people's experiences of attraction and desires for relationships.
Bisexual	Bisexuality is an attraction to more than one gender. Those who identify as bisexual feel a sexual and/or romantic attraction to people of a different gender as well as their own. While this offers a basic definition, bisexual people are a diverse group. Each individual perceives their sexual orientation differently.
Demisexual	Demisexuality is a type of sexual orientation where people who identify as demisexual feel attraction to another person if they form a strong emotional bond or connection with them first.
Gay	A Gay person is characterized by sexual or romantic attraction to people of one's same sex, often used to refer to men only.
Heterosexual/Straight	Heterosexuality is a type of sexual orientation where a person is sexually or romantically attracted to people of the opposite sex.
LGBTQ2S+	LGBTQ2S+ is an acronym that refers to the spectrum of sexual and gender identities. The plus sign (+) shows there are other identities included that aren't in the acronym. It's meant to be an inclusive term.
Lesbian	A Lesbian person is characterized by sexual or romantic attraction to people of one's same sex, often used to refer to women only.

Pansexual	Typically, individuals who identify as pansexual can feel an attraction to anyone, including individuals who do not identify as a specific gender. Pansexual people may describe their attraction as focusing on personality rather than gender.
Queer	Individuals may refer to themselves as queer when they find that preexisting sexual orientations or gender identities do not fit them.
Questioning	When individuals are in the process of figuring out their true self identity and sexual orientation, they may select this value.
Not in list	Use this value when the sexual orientation value you would like to select is not in the list.
Prefer not to say	Individuals should use this value when they do not prefer to disclose their sexual orientation.

Gender Identity

Agender	A gender identity that denotes or relates to a person who does not identify themselves as having a particular gender.
Cis-Man	A person whose assigned sex at birth is male and they identify as male.
Cis-Woman	A person whose assigned sex at birth is female and they identify as female.
Demi Gender	Demi Gender is a gender identity in which one feels a partial connection to a certain gender/genders and may identify partially, but not wholly, with a certain gender or genders. It is an umbrella term for other identities, such as demiboy, demigirl, deminonbinary, demiagender, demifluid, and more.
Female	This is the gender identity where the sex assigned at birth is female and the person identifies as the same.
Genderqueer	Individuals may refer to themselves as Genderqueer when they find that preexisting sexual orientations or gender identities do not fit them.
Male	This is the gender identity where the sex assigned at birth is male and the person identifies as the same.
Non Binary	Nonbinary gender identity is used to describe individuals who may experience a gender identity that is neither exclusively woman or man or is in between or beyond both genders.
Trans Man	Individuals whose sex assigned at birth was female but whose gender identity is male.
Trans Woman	Individuals whose sex assigned at birth was male but whose gender identity is female.
Transgender	Individuals who sex assigned at birth was different than what they presently identify themselves as.
Two Spirit	"Two-spirit" refers to individuals who identify as having both a masculine and a feminine spirit.
Not in list	Use this value when the gender identity value you would like to select is not in the list.
Prefer not to say	Individuals should use this value when they do not prefer to disclose their gender identity.

Ethnic Groups

White	A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.
Black	A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.
Hispanic or Latino	A person of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.
Asian	A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian Subcontinent, including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.
American Indian or Alaska Native	A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America) who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community attachment.
Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander	A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands
